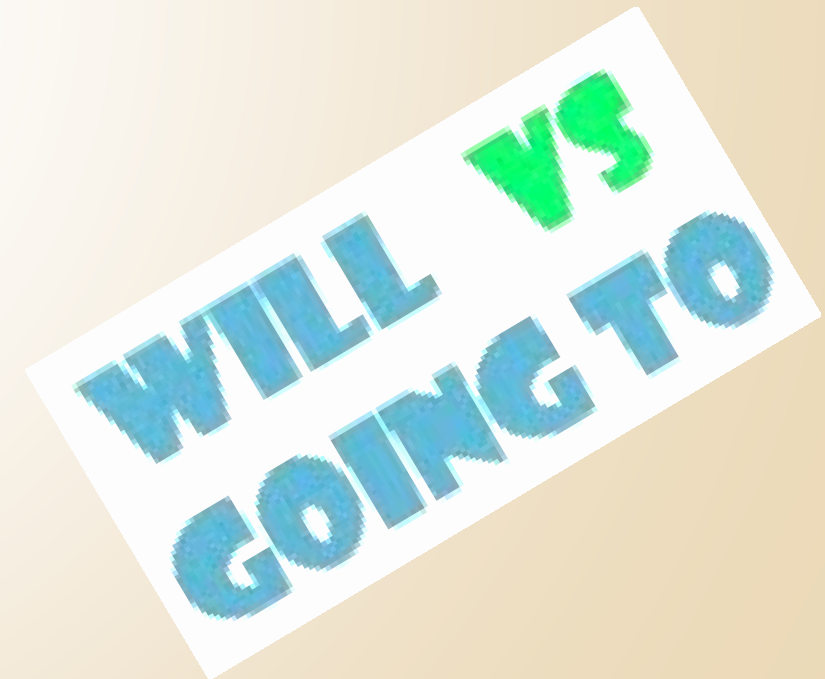

Will and going to



How to talk about memorable events at your examination

Describe a happy event of your life

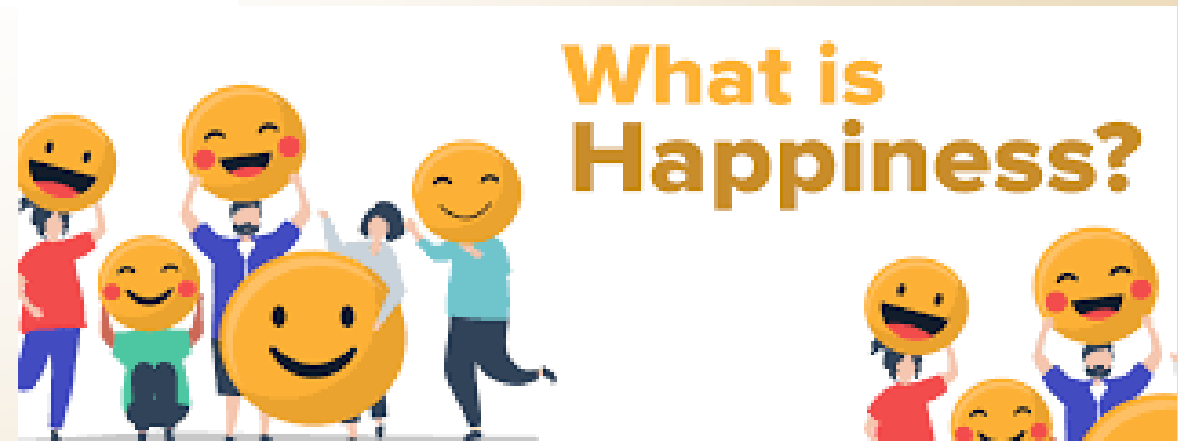
You should say:

When it happened

Where it happen

What it was

and explain why this event is a happy event in your life.



How to talk about memorable events

Describe an important letter that you received.

You should say:

Who wrote it to you?

What the letter was about?

How you felt about the letter?

And explain why the letter was important to you.



How to talk about memorable events

Describe the best gift/ present you have received

You should say:

What is the gift

Who sent it to you

When did you receive it

And explain why it was the best gift / present you have received ever



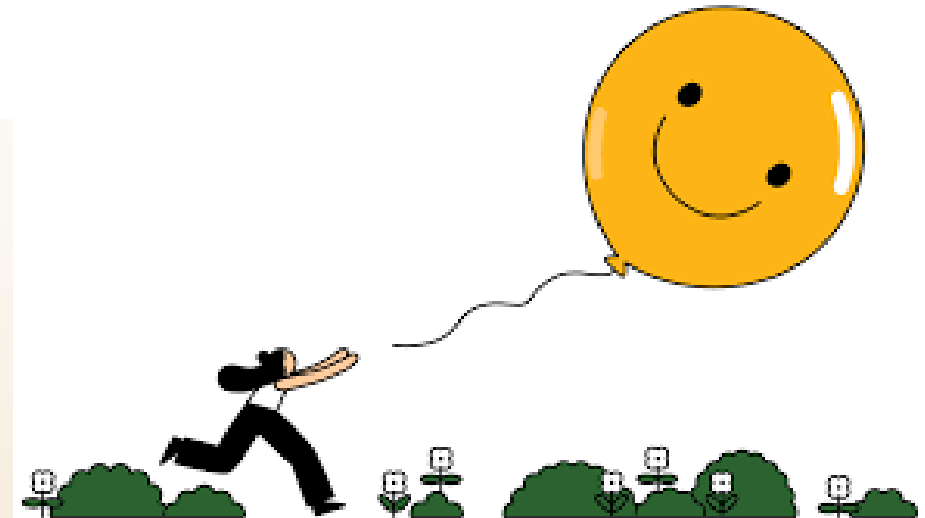
How to talk about memorable events

Describe one of your childhood memories

You should say:

- What is it
- When it happened
- How it affected you in your life

and explain why you still remember it



How to talk about memorable events

Describe a big public event that you have attended.

You should say:

- what it was
- when was it held and why
- what happened

and explain how you felt about being there



How to talk about memorable events

Describe your favorite Restaurant.

You should say:

- Where it is
- What it looks like inside and outside
- What kinds of foods they serve

What makes this restaurant so special to you and others





SIMPLE FUTURE

We use it to express:

- offering help
- promise
- prediction

Future Tense: Will → Form

Affirmative: I **will** travel to Madrid in October.

Interrogative: **Will** you travel by bus?

Negative: I **will not** travel - **won't**.

Will you travel by train or by bus?

I **won't** travel by bus I **will** probably travel by train



You're cold. I'll close the window. - **offering help**
I'll buy you a new dog. - **promise**

GOING TO FUTURE

We use it to express:

- intention
- plan
- something that is likely to happen

Future Tense: Going to → Form

Affirmative: I **am going to** travel by plane

Interrogative: **Are you going to** travel by plane?

Negative: I **am not going to** travel by plane because I **am**

going to fly in a hot air balloon



I'm going to be polite. - **intention**
He is going to start a diet. - **plan**
Look at the clouds! It is going to rain. - **likely to happen**
