

#### Comparatives & Superlatives

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e.g. big \rightarrow bigger \rightarrow the biggest
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fat  $\rightarrow$  fatter  $\rightarrow$  the fattest

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1 hot \rightarrow hotter \rightarrow the hottest
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2 cold  $\rightarrow$  colder  $\rightarrow$  the coldest

3 wet  $\rightarrow$  wetter  $\rightarrow$  the wettest

4 heavy  $\rightarrow$  heavier  $\rightarrow$  the heaviest

5 warm  $\rightarrow$  warmer  $\rightarrow$  the warmest

6 hungry > hungrier > the hungriest





#### **IRREGULAR FORMS**

Some adjectives / adverbs have irregular forms:

good/wellb

bad/badly

far

better best

worse worst

farther farthest

further furthest

 We can use elder / eldest instead of older / oldest for people in the same family.





### So and such

We often use so and such to talk about cause and effect.

The problem was so difficult that we couldn't solve it.

It was such a difficult problem that we couldn't solve it.







The car was so expensive (that) we couldn't buy it. He spoke so quickly (that) I couldn't understand him.

There were <u>so many</u> people (that) I couldn't find a seat.

There was <u>so much</u> noise (that) I couldn't hear.





such + adjective + noun + that + clause

It was such a hot day (that) I went for a swim.

It was such hot weather (that) I went for a swim. They are such good players (that) they will probably win the game.

There were <u>such a lot of</u> people that ...
There was <u>such a lot of</u> noise that ...



### Too and enough



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too + adjective / adverb + (for + noun) + (to + infinitive)
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The music is too loud.

He speaks too loudly.


He is too old for the job.

He is too old to apply for the job.

It's too cold for the kids to go out.

There were too <u>many</u> people in the room.
There was too <u>much</u> noise at the party.







It's warm enough.

He speaks slowly enough.

He isn't old enough to order a beer.

It isn't warm enough for the kids to play outside.

There aren't enough biscuits.

I haven't got enough money for a new mobile.

There isn't enough time for us to go shopping.

- It was (too / such) a beautiful day. The sun was shining brightly.
- 2. Kenya is a country that isn't (so / such) expensive to live in.
- 3. John is (so / too) handsome. He is the cutest boy in my class.
- 4. There were (so / too) many people at the party. It was extremely crowded.
- 5. I like ice cream (so / too) much. It is my favorite food.
- 6. "The Omen" and "The Shining" were (so / such) scary films.
- 7. The shoes were (so / too) big. They didn't fit me.
- 8. There was (so / such) much rain in July! It felt like winter.
- 9. There was (so / too) much salt in the soup. It was horrible.
- 10. They were (so / such) nice people. I hope we visit them again soon.
