






Examples



As subject of a sentence

- Writing in English is difficult.
- Watching TV is my favorite pastime.

As direct object of a sentence

- I like writing in English.
- I love going out to restaurants.

As a subject complement

- My cat's favorite activity is sleeping.
- One of his duties is doing homework.



As an object of a preposition

- We shall be interested in hearing your comments.
- Would you like to walk instead of taking the bus?
- My cat's favorite activity is sleeping.
- One of his duties is doing homework.






- After modal auxiliary verbs (Will, shall, would, could...)
