







TYPE and USE	Modal Verb	Examples
ABILITY	Can, Could	 I can speak English. He could run 10 km, now he has lost practise.
PERMISSION	Can, Could, May	 You can't go out tonight. May I sit here? Could you help me?
ADVICE	Should	 You should do your homework. I shouldn't drink alcohol.
OBLIGATION	Must, Have to	 People mustn't smoke in class. We don't have to go to the party if we don't want to.
POSSIBLITY	Might, May, Could, Can	 It might rain today. Rachel may come to the party if she feels better.











Ø MODALL VERBS



CAN	COULD	
ABILITY (present) I can speak four languages.	ABILITY (past) He could play football when he was a kid.	
• POSSIBILITY Alcohol can cause cancer.	• POSSIBILITY A lot of crime could be prevented.	
• PERMISSION (Informal) Can I use your book, please?	• PERMISSION (polite) Could I take your book, please?	
REQUEST (Informal) Can you make me coffee?	REQUEST Could you lend me this book?	
OFFER Can I help you? (help)	• SUGGESTION I could help you with English.	
CAN NOT (not allowed) You can not (can't) smoke here.	CONDITIONAL OF CAN Some suggestion.
