

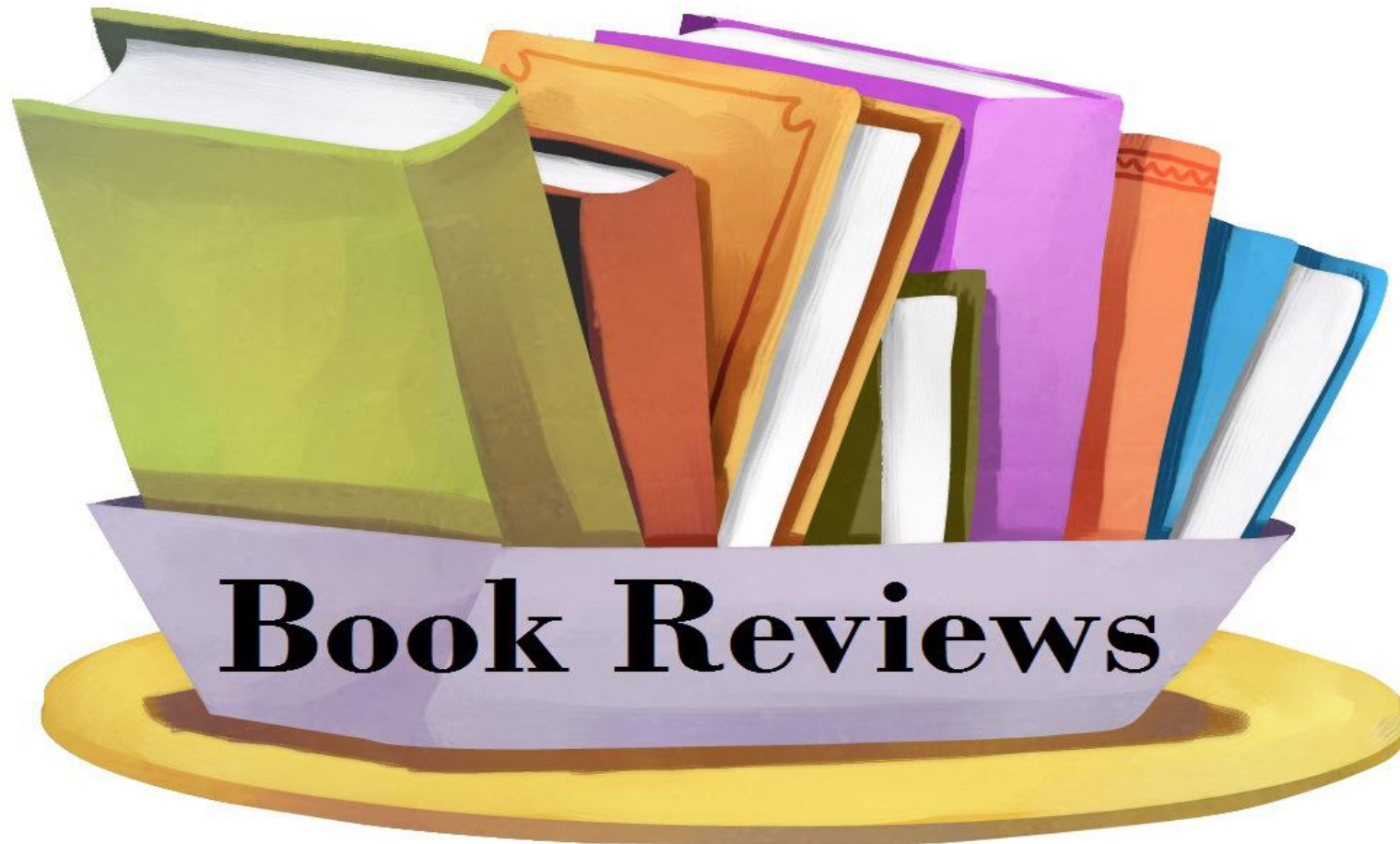


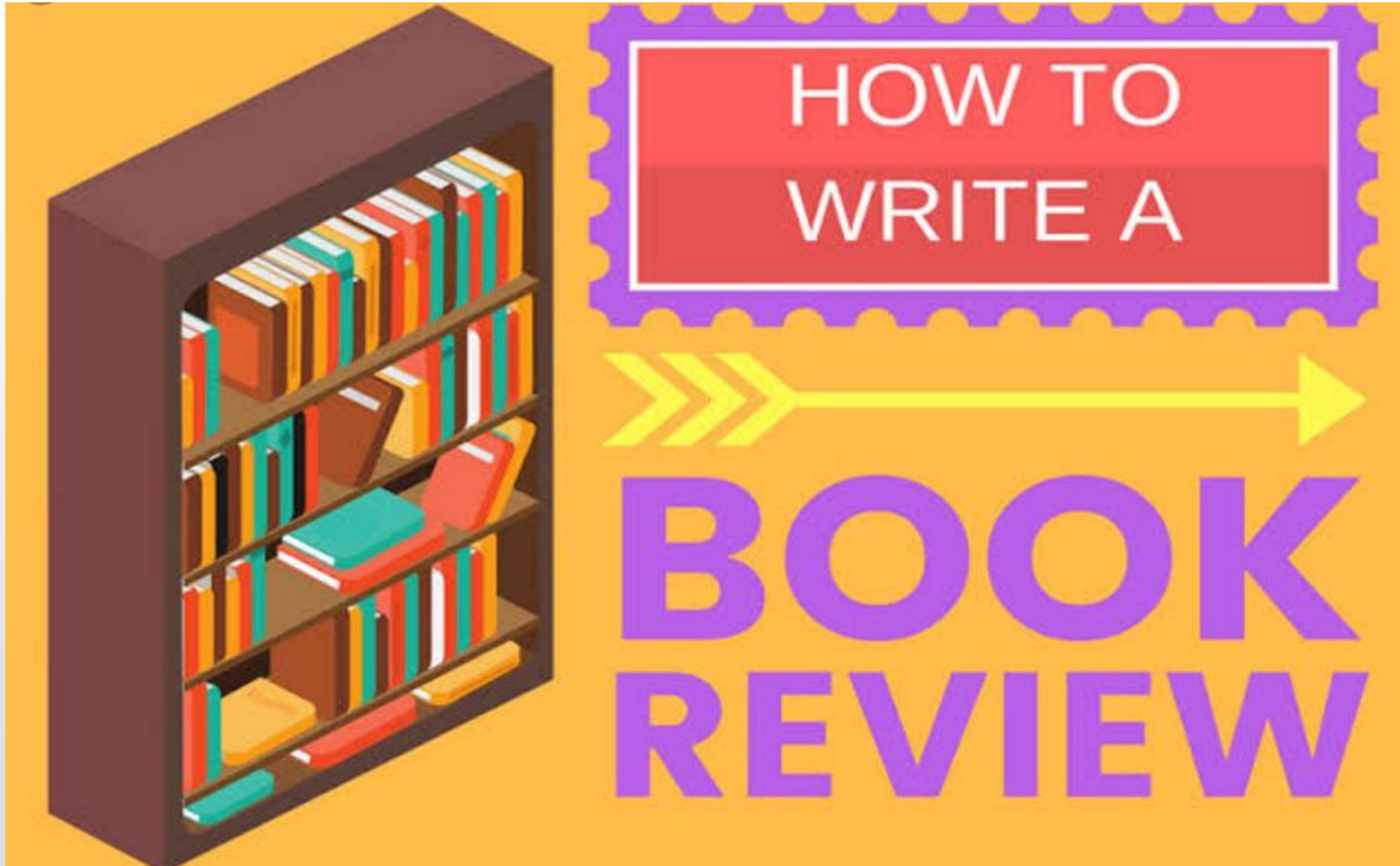

Book review





The structure of a review

- Typically a review can be separated into these main parts:
 - Introduction – introduce the book in such a way that it grabs the reader's attention
 - Brief summary – outline main points of the book (can include short quotes)
 - Evaluation - analyze and discuss style, characterization, tone, pacing, etc.
 - Conclusion – summarize your ideas and recommend (or not)

WRITING YOUR BOOK REVIEW

- **Understand the structure of a book review.**
 - Book reviews begin with a summary of the book that avoids giving away too much about the book. The summarizing paragraph is followed by a paragraph that conveys your opinion of the book.
- **Keep your audience in mind.**
 - Your audience is the group of readers (perhaps your teacher and classmates) that will be reading your book review. Remember that your audience has not read the book. You must introduce the characters and plot efficiently so that your audience feels like they have a basic understanding of the book.
- **Write the summary.**
 - Keep your summary brief. Discuss the main idea of the book, the plot, and the major characters. Do not go into too much detail- you have a limited amount of space to write in, so only give the most important details about the plot and characters.

Would you recommend this book to another person?

What type of person would like this book?

Why? Or Why not?

Who are the main characters of the book? What place does each character occupy in the book?



How does the plot unfold to the fullest extent? Is it clear, intriguing and interesting to the reader?



What tools does the author use to enhance the perception of the book?



What advantages and disadvantages can you highlight in the book?



What is your personal opinion about the book?
