# PAST PERFECT SIMPLE

## Past Perfect Simple

### Affirmative

I/you had waited  
he/she/it had waited  
we/you/they had waited

### Negative

I/you had not waited  
he/she/it had not waited  
we/you/they had not waited

### Question

Had I/you waited?  
Had he/she/it waited?  
Had we/you/they waited?

waiting  
we/you/they had been  
waiting

### Negative

I/you had not been  
waiting  
he/she/it had not been  
waiting  
we/you/they had not been  
waiting

### Question

Had I/you been  
waiting?  
Had he/she/it been  
waiting?  
Have we/you/they been  
waiting?
