



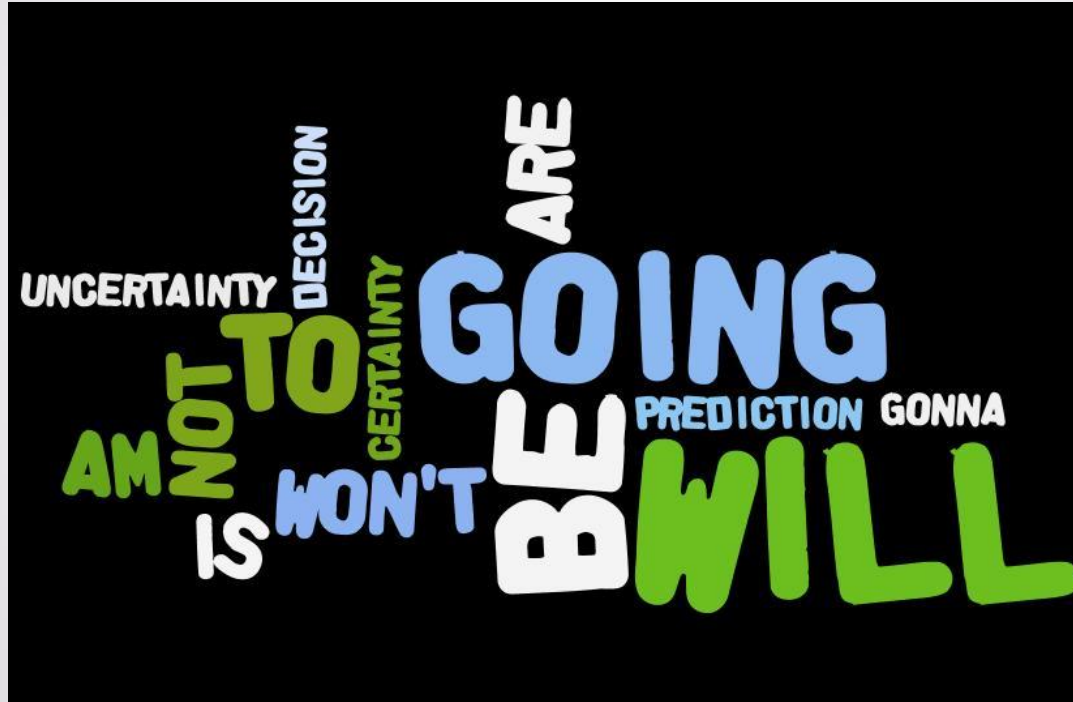

FUTURE TIME

The future is uncertain. We know the past. We know the present. We do not know the future. We can be 100% sure or certain about the past and the present. But we can never be 100% certain about the future. In English there are several structures and tenses to talk about the future. It is usually the degree of certainty about the future that decides our choice of structure or tense.



FUTURE TIME

Future time:

- When we use the future tense, it's important to say **when** something is going to happen.
- E.g. I'm going to watch the Lotte Giants **tonight**.
- I'm going to meet my friend **tomorrow**.
- He's going to eat kalbi **next Saturday**.
- We're going to travel to Japan **next summer**.
- She's going to visit her grandmother for **Chuseok**.
- We are going to finish class **soon**.

FUTURE TIME CLAUSES

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when, as soon as, until, once, before, after, while

After these words, use present (NOT future) to talk about the future.

future time clause

When I **am** 69

As soon as you **arrive**

Until you all **finish**

Before you **come**

Once you **are** there

present

future / imperative / modal verb

I **will** retire

✗ When I ~~will be~~ 69, I will retire.

✓ When I am 69, I will retire.

NO COMMA when you put the main clause at the beginning
